Objectives

This course focuses on clinical neurology that chiropractors can and should use in their offices on a regular basis. I dispense with theoretical neurology and tests that are rarely used and, instead, focus on how to recognize the very common neurological deficits that walk into chiropractic offices every week. This course focuses not only on "How" to evaluate a patient but also "What" these tests mean, "When" each test should be done and for what clinical symptoms and "Why" it is the chiropractor's responsibility to perform these tests or screen for these neurological conditions and/or injuries.

Outline

Hour 1. Neurology evaluation for injured and/or neurologically compromised patients and practical application for implementation to everyday practice.

Hour 2. Introduce concept of various brain functions and practical clinical application for DC's.

Hour 3. Evaluating and treating patients with symptoms such as dizziness, vertigo, lightheadedness, balance problems, etc. Easy and practical tests/evaluations to determine causes of the various symptoms and easy practical treatment options.

Hour 4. Giving the body and brain what it needs to heal and function. Learn concepts of neurocognitive and metabolic functions affected by stress and injury. Learn practical nutritional, clinical and other treatments.

Hour 5. Introduction to neuro-rehabilitation. Review neurophysiology of the spine and brain as it applies to commonly encountered chiropractic patients such as the whiplash patient.

Hour 6. Discussion of California scope of practice and techniques we can use to treat neurological injuries. How to communicate the patients' individual neurological injury or condition to the patient as well as other specialists which may co-treat the patient. How to explain various treatment options for each patient.
